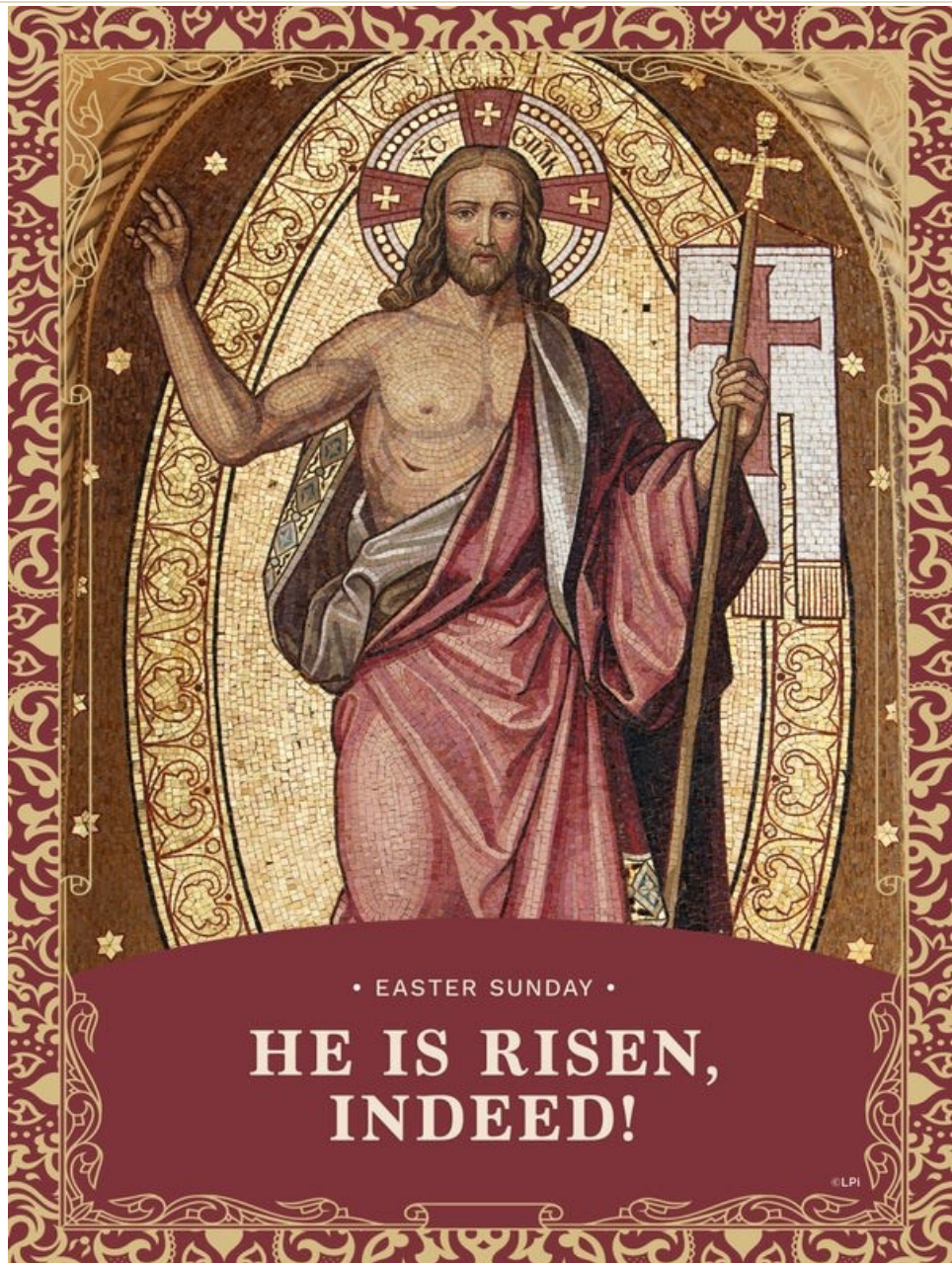

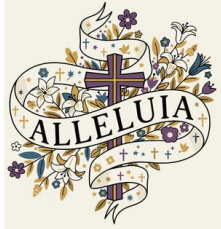
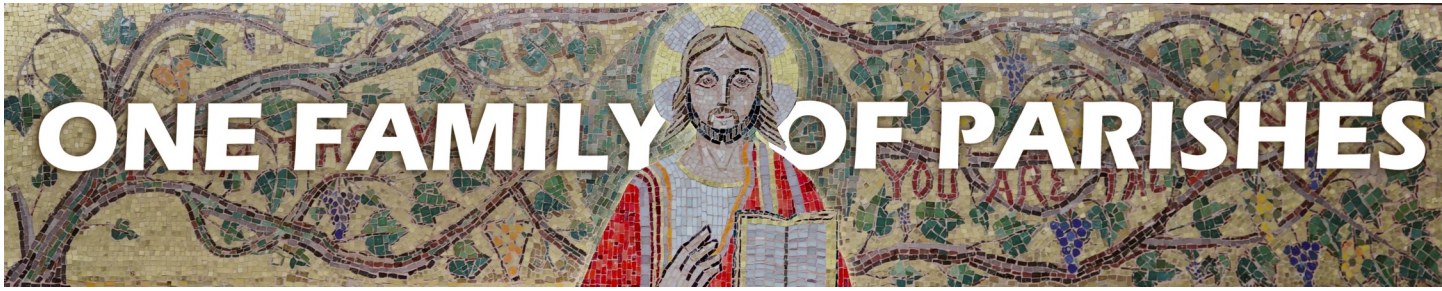

LET US BE AN ALLELUIA PEOPLE!

Today we celebrate Easter Sunday of the Lord's Resurrection.

The Easter season is 50 days from the Sunday of the Resurrection to Pentecost Sunday and are celebrated in joy and exultation as one feast day.

These are the days above all others in which the Alleluia is sung!

NOTE: Responsorial Psalms that we sing between the first and second reading every week, may be substituted with "Alleluia" as a response during this season.

After reviewing this option and discussion with Fr. Marco, we will sing "Alleluia" as our Responsorial response during the 50 days of Easter.

This means, instead of the Psalm response/antiphon that is usually intoned/sung by the cantor, you will hear an "Alleluia" sung. This is also shown in the Sunday's Word as an option.

REMEMBER.... Your immediate reaction will be to stand. Please note, this is still the Responsorial response and is not meant as a time to stand. Remain seated until after the second reading when the Gospel acclamation will be proclaimed and you see the President stand.

It may be a bit confusing at first, but after 40 days without singing our praises, this will be a beautiful way to sing for joy and lift our praises to the Lord multiple times throughout the Mass!!

UPCOMING HOURS FOR "DROP-IN" AT THE ONE FAMILY CATHOLIC CENTER

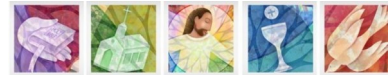

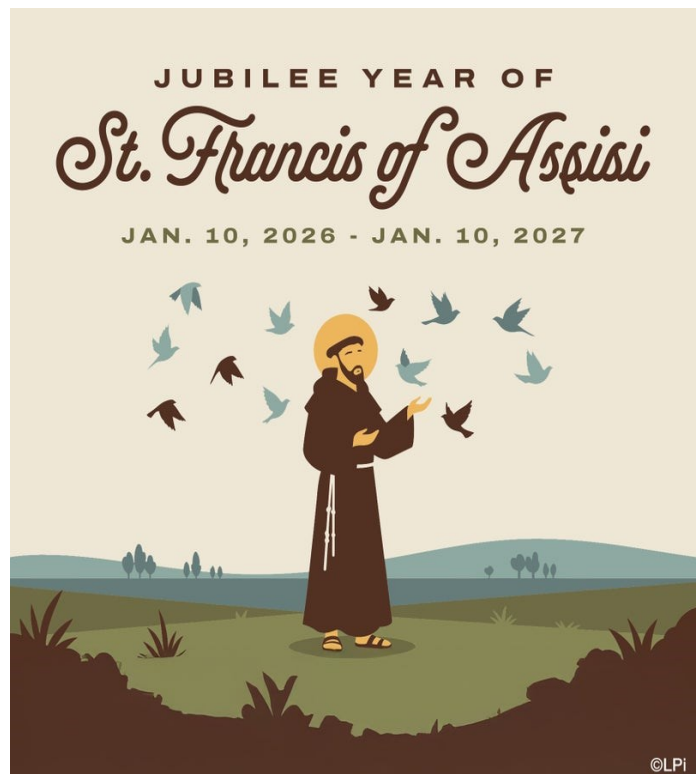

Christ's Resurrection Changes Everything

The Resurrection of Jesus is the center of our faith and the light that gives meaning to everything. It is not just one event among many, but the moment when God's love shows its full power over sin and death. It is a foundational event for a new kind of existence. As we hear in the Gospel, the tomb is empty, and the disciples begin to understand: Jesus is alive! This changes everything. It means that life is stronger than death, and that love has the final word. As a matter of fact, the Resurrection is the most impactful event in human history, because it gives our hope a firm foundation.

But what really happened in the Resurrection? It is not simply that Jesus returned to His old life. He entered a new and indestructible life in God. Because He was united completely with the Father, death could not hold Him. Life itself broke through death. This is why the Resurrection is not only about Jesus—it is also about us. Through faith and baptism, we are connected to this new life. A bridge has been opened for us. The light of Christ reaches us even now, and we are invited to walk in that light, leaving behind sin and fear.

The Resurrection also brings a deep and lasting joy. It is not a passing feeling, but a sure hope. Like someone who already holds the winning ticket, we rejoice because we know what is coming. Even in times of darkness, suffering, or confusion, the Resurrection tells us that God is at work. It reminds us that our struggles are not the end of the story. Christ walks with us, and nothing—not even death—can separate us from His love. This is why the Church calls us to be people of light, people who carry this hope into the world.

Today, more than ever, we are invited to look at our world through the light of the Resurrection. In the midst of uncertainty, pain, and division, we proclaim that Christ is alive. This truth gives meaning to our lives and strength to our hearts. Let us not keep this hope to ourselves. Let us live as witnesses of the risen Lord, bringing His light into our families, our communities, and our world. And so, with faith and courage, let us look at the present moment in the light of the Resurrection, and in doing so, become bearers of hope for all.

Aren't we all priests?

All baptized Christians share in the **common priesthood of the faithful**. This means they can offer their lives, prayers, and actions to God, take part in worship, and live out their faith each day. However, not all baptized people belong to the **ministerial priesthood**. Only those who are ordained (such as priests and bishops) can celebrate the Eucharist, forgive sins, and act in the person of Christ in a sacramental way. In short: all the baptized share in the common priesthood, but only the ordained share in the ministerial priesthood. The ministerial priesthood exists to serve others, not to dominate them. As St. Augustine said, "With you I am a Christian; for you I am a bishop."

To reflect on: Am I living up to the dignity of the common priesthood of the faithful that I received in my baptism?

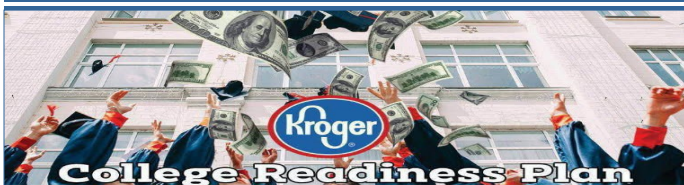
