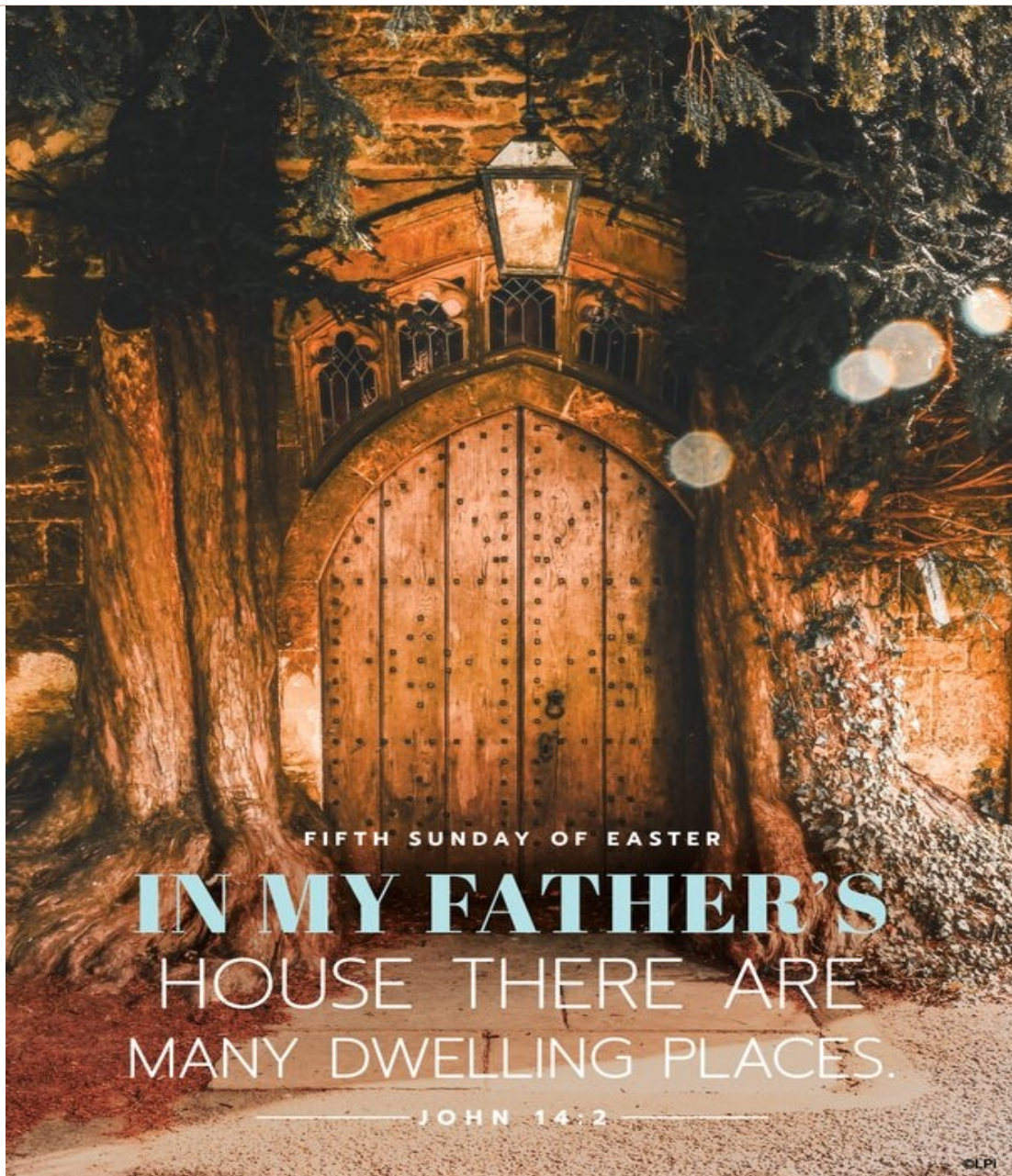

Announcing the Gospel with Clarity and Charity

In his recent apostolic journey to Africa, Pope Leo XIV has stood out as a global moral authority marked by both clarity and charity. In an interview during this significant trip, the Holy Father reflected on the idea of universal fraternity, describing it not as a vague sentiment, but as the “authentic respect for all men and women,” grounded in their inherent dignity as creatures loved by God. This vision challenges us to treat every person with the respect they deserve, regardless of background or circumstance.

The Pope also offered a helpful clarification of Pope Francis’ phrase “*todos, todos, todos*” (everyone, everyone, everyone), which expresses the Church’s firm conviction that all are welcomed and invited into her life. At the same time, he emphasized that this inclusivity is fundamentally an invitation to conversion. While the doors of the Church are open to all, being welcomed does not mean that every action is affirmed; rather, it is a call to conform our lives ever more deeply to the Gospel.

“No one comes to the Father except through me,” says the Lord in today’s Gospel. He calls each of us to walk the way that is He Himself. The Christian life is a journey of living as He taught us, trusting that He will lead us to the everlasting joy for which our hearts long—even when that path challenges our status quo or disrupts the ways of life we have already settled into.

As a parish community, we are called to embody this same “clarity and charity” in our daily lives: to welcome all with open hearts while remaining firm in the truth of our faith. Let us take time to reflect on these teachings and strive to live with fidelity to Christ, following the path of conversion He sets before us. Finally, let us unite in fervent prayer for the Pope in his apostolic ministry, asking God to grant him continued strength and wisdom to guide the Church with courage and sound judgment.

Who is the Pope?



The Pope is the Bishop of Rome and the **successor of Saint Peter, whom Jesus chose to lead His Church.** In the Gospel, Jesus says to Peter, “You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my Church” (Matthew 16:18), and after the Resurrection He entrusts him with a mission: “Feed my sheep” (John 21:17). Because of this, the Pope serves as a visible shepherd for all Christians, helping to keep the Church united in faith and guiding it in truth and charity. The

Pope teaches the faith, encourages the faithful, and watches over the Church so that it remains faithful to Christ’s teachings. His ministry is one of service, following the example of Jesus, who said, “Whoever would be great among you must be your servant” (Matthew 20:26). In this way, the Pope helps lead the Church toward Christ, reminding us always to follow Him as the way to the Father.

Call to action: Pray for the Pope and his intentions so that he is able to continue leading the Catholic Church with fidelity, wisdom, charity, and clarity.

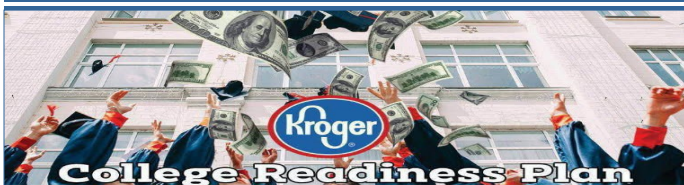
