PASTOR'S REFLECTIONS

October 5, 2025
27th Sunday in Ordinary Time
The Virtue of Faith

Faith, as *Fides et Ratio* reminds us, isn't about closing your eyes and jumping into the dark. It's about trusting the God who has already shown Himself to be faithful and true. St. John Paul II said that faith and reason are like two wings that lift us up toward the truth. Faith takes us higher than reason alone can reach, while reason keeps our faith from turning into superstition or mere feelings. Living by faith means handing ourselves over completely to God, believing that His wisdom is greater than ours, and letting His Word be the light that guides us through the confusion and doubts of life.

Faith doesn't cancel out the need to think — it brings our thinking to a new level. It makes reason a partner in the journey, helping us see that what we believe and what we understand are meant to fit together. Faith lets us look at the world, our history, and even our struggles through Christ's eyes. It opens us up to mysteries we can't fully explain, but it never goes against the truth that reason can grasp. Instead, it shows us that our hunger for meaning only finds rest in God.

So, brothers and sisters, let's live our faith with courage. The culture around us often sets reason against belief, or praises doubt as if it were wisdom. But we know faith is not weakness — it's strength, because it anchors us in the One who is Truth itself. Let's ask God to deepen this gift of faith in our hearts so that we don't just believe with our minds, but also live it out with our lives, giving witness to the joy and freedom of walking with Christ.

Regarding The Society of Our Lady, Queen of all Saints

Each of us in the Catholic faith community has a responsibility to reduce error, avoid schism, and promote ecclesiastical communion. To that end, the Archdiocese of Detroit shares the following information about a group operating in Southfield and elsewhere called “The Society of Our Lady, Queen of all Saints,” which presents itself as “a group of Catholic clergy offering the traditional sacraments.”

As of August 2025, the group was renting space in The Church of the Redeemer, an Episcopal church in Southfield. Previously, they occupied space in Taylor at the Little Rose Chapel Shrine, which has no affiliation with the Archdiocese of Detroit. An individual identifying himself as clergy from The Society of Our Lady, Queen of all Saints has visited Archdiocesan parishes in the area.

In the interest of truth and to avoid confusion among the faithful, we must clarify that, as best we are able to tell, The Society of Our Lady, Queen of all Saints is NOT an organization in ecclesiastical communion with the Catholic Church. Catholics are advised to avoid association with this group.

Thank you for your attention to this important matter. Let us pray that God will bring all Christian communities into full communion with the Roman Catholic Church, so that we may all be one. (cf. John 17:21)

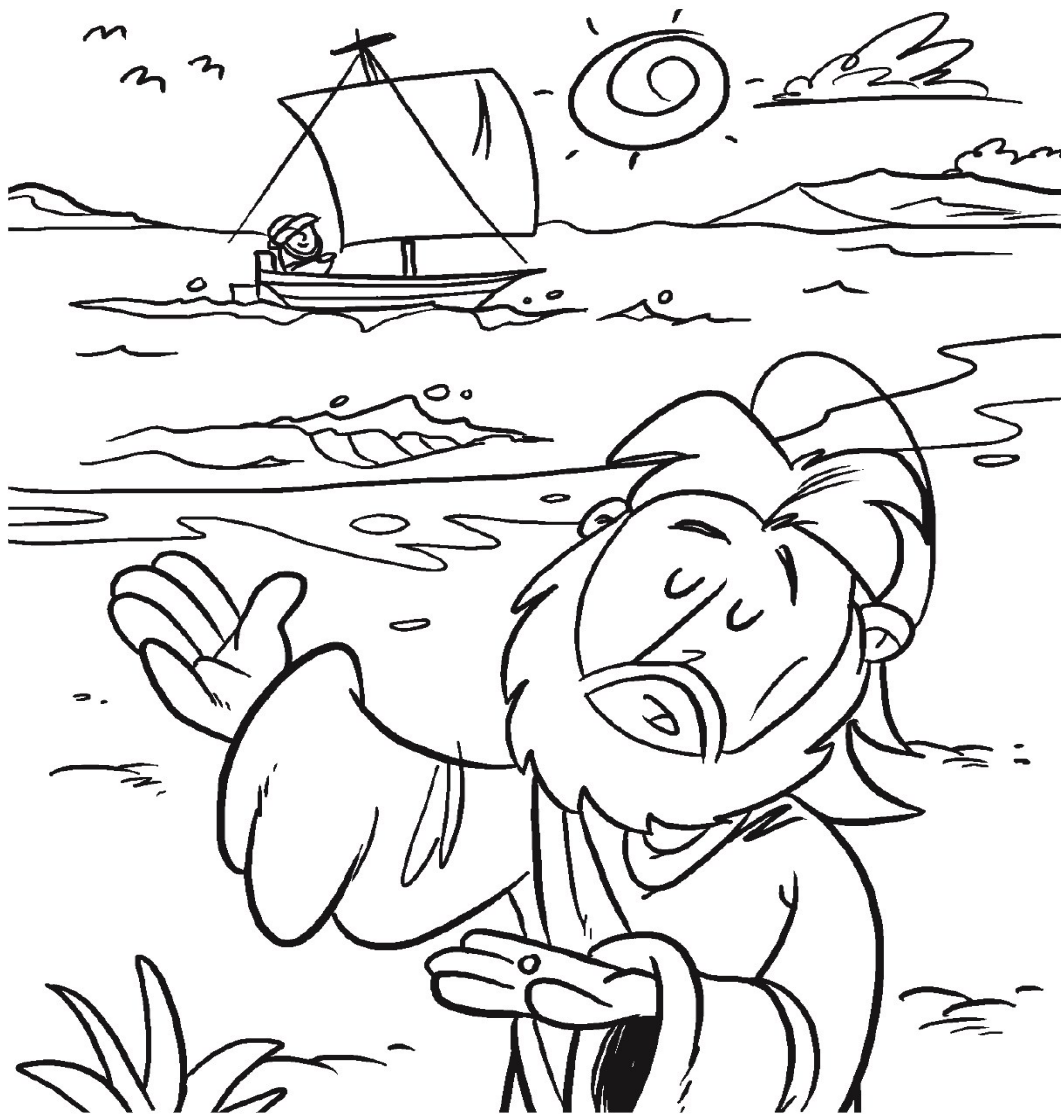
