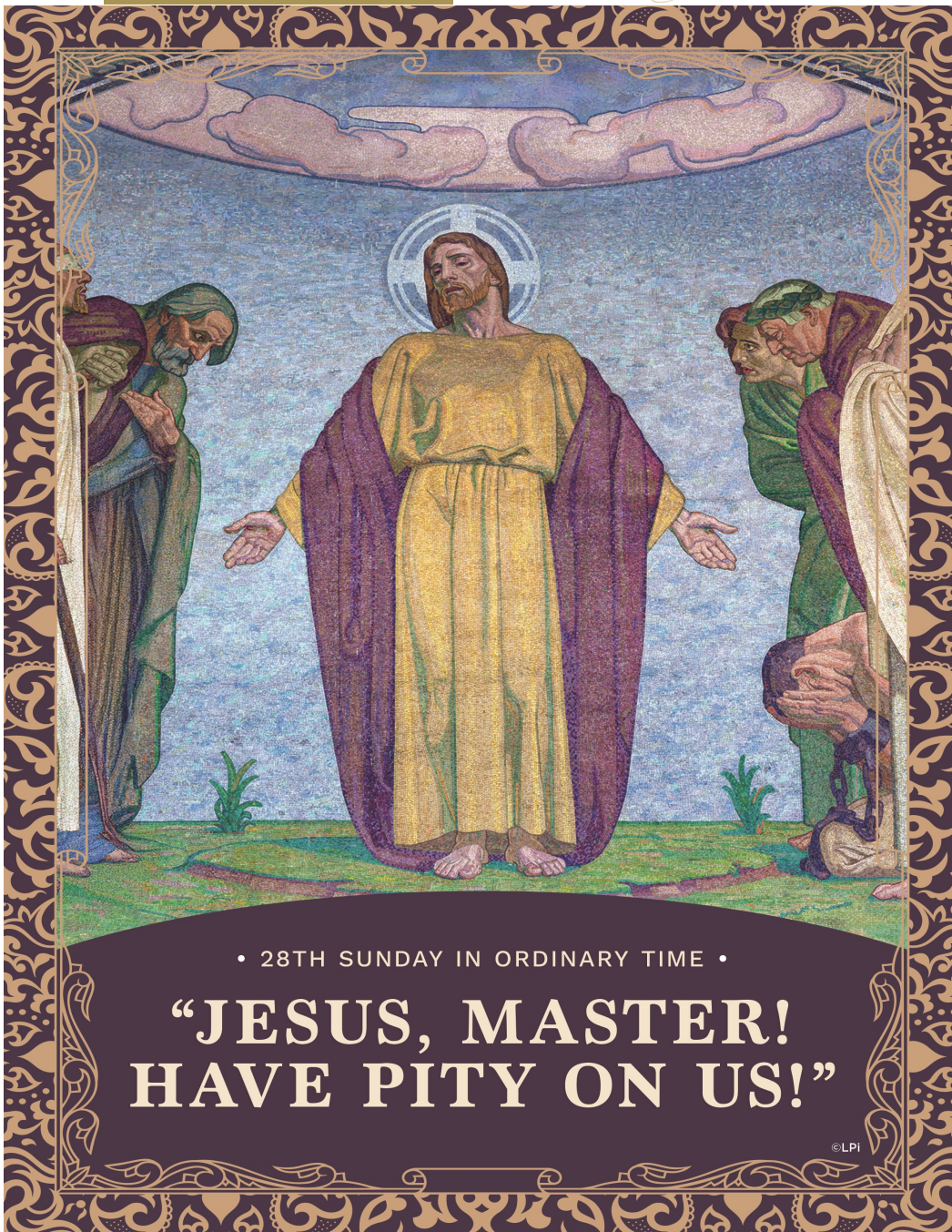

PASTOR'S REFLECTIONS

October 12, 2025
28th Sunday in Ordinary Time
Gratitude and Grace

Gratitude and grace are closely related in life: nothing moves us to be grateful like receiving a gift, a grace, a good that we needed or desired but that for some reason was beyond our foresight, resources, or strength.

The healing of leprosy, which also implied the beginning of the healing of the sick person's entire social and interpersonal life, is a gift, a grace of that nature. And the pagan Naaman, like the healed Samaritan in today's Gospel, expresses immense gratitude. It is no coincidence that these are two people who did not directly belong to the people of God: precisely the more "excluded" they seem to be, the more they rejoice in feeling and knowing they were healed.

There is a lesson for us here: those who most recognize their need and those who least believe they deserve the remedy are those who best and most readily see God's hand and are grateful for it. And the opposite is also true: those who consider themselves very strong or who assume they deserve everything find little to give thanks for. Let us pray so that we may always recognize ourselves as bearers of undeserved graces from God, especially the Eucharist, God Himself under the appearance of bread and wine, and, therefore, live grateful lives loving God and neighbor.

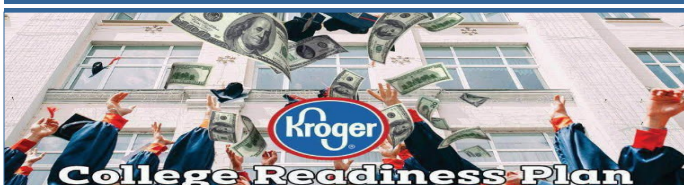

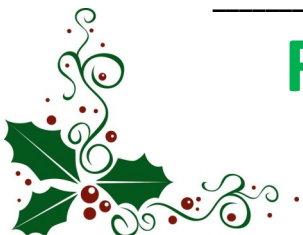

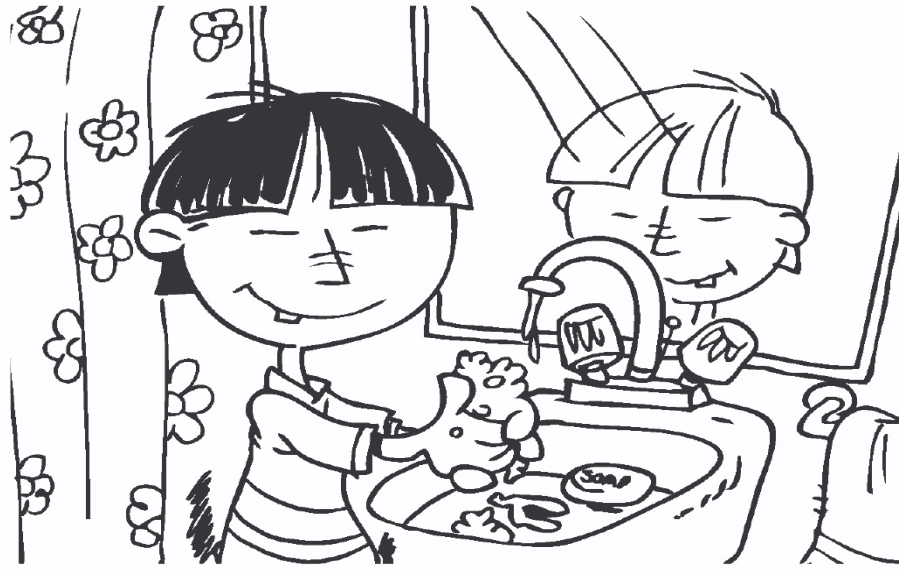
Regarding The Society of Our Lady, Queen of all Saints

Each of us in the Catholic faith community has a responsibility to reduce error, avoid schism, and promote ecclesiastical communion. To that end, the Archdiocese of Detroit shares the following information about a group operating in Southfield and elsewhere called “The Society of Our Lady, Queen of all Saints,” which presents itself as “a group of Catholic clergy offering the traditional sacraments.”

As of August 2025, the group was renting space in The Church of the Redeemer, an Episcopal church in Southfield. Previously, they occupied space in Taylor at the Little Rose Chapel Shrine, which has no affiliation with the Archdiocese of Detroit. An individual identifying himself as clergy from The Society of Our Lady, Queen of all Saints has visited Archdiocesan parishes in the area.

In the interest of truth and to avoid confusion among the faithful, we must clarify that, as best we are able to tell, **The Society of Our Lady, Queen of all Saints is NOT an organization in ecclesiastical communion with the Catholic Church. Catholics are advised to avoid association with this group.**

Thank you for your attention to this important matter. Let us pray that God will bring all Christian communities into full communion with the Roman Catholic Church, so that we may all be one. (cf. John 17:21)

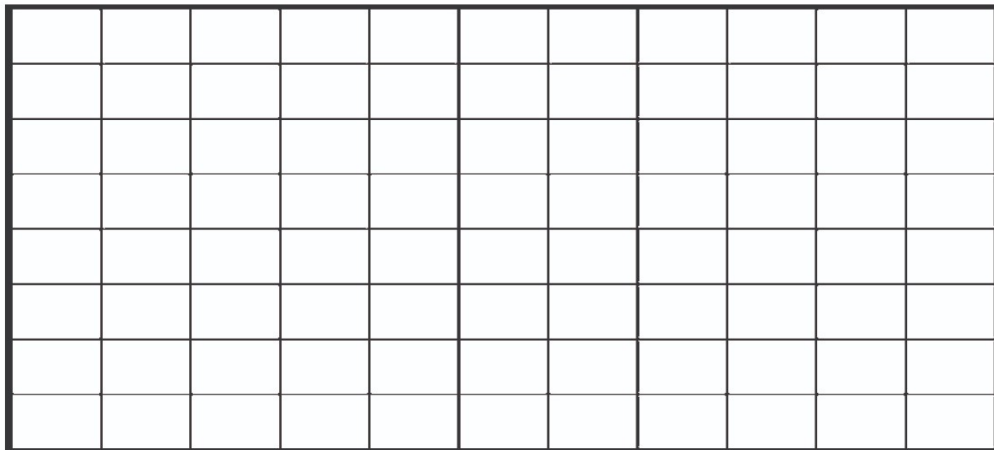
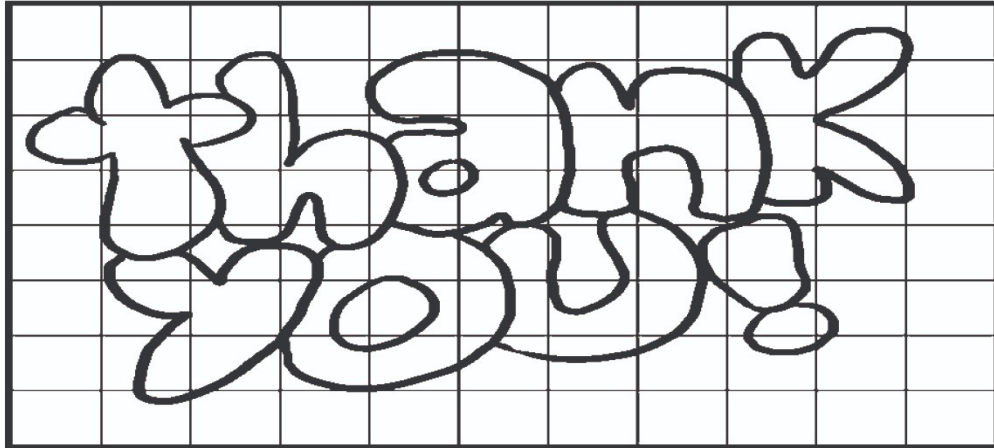
