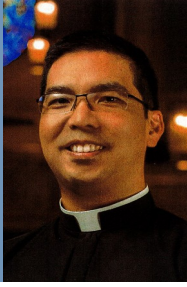

As we approach the end of the liturgical year, we're reminded by the Word of God that nothing in this world lasts forever—not our successes or failures, not our institutions, not even our sacred spaces. Things break down, plans change, and sometimes the ground beneath us shakes. But Christ is different—He's the foundation that holds up when everything else falls apart. It makes sense to plant our hope in Him, knowing He isn't going anywhere.

When Jesus talks about the destruction of the temple, He isn't trying to scare us; He's actually telling us not to panic. Don't get caught up in the fear, drama, or wild predictions. Instead, stay steady and remain with Jesus, no matter what's happening around you. Perseverance isn't just about hanging on—it's about showing what matters most to you, especially when it's tough. Even if things get rocky, those moments can build genuine, lasting faith.

What Is Sanctifying Grace?

Sanctifying grace is the free and undeserved gift of God's own life that He shares with us to make us holy and capable of living with Him forever. It's first given in Baptism and stays in the soul as long as we remain in friendship with God (that is, without mortal sin). This grace transforms us from within, making us children of God, temples of the Holy Spirit, and heirs to heaven—it's what

allows us to truly share in God's divine nature. We call this being in a state of grace. (CCC 1996-2000) “If you were to see the beauty of a soul in the state of grace, you would be so overwhelmed with love for it that you would risk your life a thousand times for its salvation.”

The Shepherd and The lost Sheep



Representatives from the Holy land with The Shepherd And The Lost Sheep will be with us on **November 22 & 23, 2025**, to ask for your help and blessing for the native people of the Holy Land in Bethlehem. These families, sixty years ago, made up 18% of the population. Due to recent events in the Middle East, it has caused these families to face devastating economical strain, and caused the population to decrease to less than 1% in the Holy Land. These families have relied on the income from their religious hand carved olive wood artifacts to tourist. So we have come to the USA to try to help support these families by bringing their artifacts here to sell in the USA. All the proceed from sales will be sent back to the families of the Holy Land so that they may be able to keep their homes and provide for their families. The last few years were very tough for the Christian families, and this is the only source of income .
